I am glad to report that we are seeing a decrease in COVID positive cases.

**Although we will continue to be in outbreak status in Assisted Living our updated numbers are as follows:**

- 13 residents in Assisted Living
  - 8 residents on ALU 2<sup>nd</sup> floor (non-memory care).
  - 2 residents in Dorothy's Place
  - 3 residents on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of Assisted Living.
    - All residents who have tested positive have mild to moderate symptoms and are being managed comfortably here at Bayview with collaboration from their physicians and family
- 2 health care workers who will not return to work until medically cleared

We are hopeful that communal activities will resume early next week with direction from our Local Health Jurisdiction.

Bayview staff will continue to wear masks throughout the building at this time.

- **Visitation is not restricted;** however, we are asking visitors to consider postponing visits until the outbreak is clear to help keep the viral load down. If you are visiting a resident who is COVID positive please consider wearing the PPE provided outside of the residents' room.
- **All visitors need to wear a mask to visit assisted living, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> or Dorothy's Place at this time.**

**A few reminders:**

- If you are not feeling well, please take care of yourself, consult your primary care physician if applicable, and stay home to avoid getting anyone else sick.
- We encourage the use of rapid self-tests, also called at-home tests, as a quick and convenient way to screen for COVID-19 on your own. You may find rapid tests in stores, pharmacies and online.
